Advanced Abdominal Pregnancy

Abstract

Objective. Abdominal pregnancy is one form of ectopic pregnancy with a very rare incidence. There is a challenge in enforcing diagnosis and management of abdominal pregnancy.

Methods. This study is a case report of a 25 years old female, G2P0A1, 37 weeks pregnancy, who came with complaints of abdominal pain every time of fetal movement. Ultrasound examination showed a single extrauterine fetus with a lie presentation. The implantation of the placenta was posteriorly but no uterine wall. Amniotic fluid was reduced, and no visible part of the fetus was shown in the uterus.

Results. The patient was treated with a laparotomy. Neonates died with grade II maceration and fetal abnormalities in the face area. Management of the placenta was carried out by ligation of the proximal umbilical cord and the placenta was left in situ. Postoperative patients was clinically stable.

Conclusion. Early diagnosis and management of abdominal pregnancy is very important to reduce mortality and morbidity of maternal and fetal.
