Gakushuin Law School

Dr. Kyaw Nyi Nyi, Ph.D., MHRD., M.Sc.
National University of Singapore

Dr. Kyaw Nyi Nyi, Ph.D., MHRD., M.Sc has published articles on Buddhist nationalism, citizenship and Muslims in Myanmar. His main work is on How Buddhist Nationalism has Led to the Passage of Four Racial and Religious Laws in Myanmar, coupled with other projects on citizenship, constitutional politics, and human rights in Myanmar.



Prof. Dr. Muhammad Akib, S.H., M.Hum.
Faculty of Law University of Lampung

Professor Muhammad Akib is a senior lecturer at the Faculty of Law, University of Lampung. Starting teaching from 1987 and continue to be very productive, he becomes the only expert on environmental law in Lampung University since 2011. His dissertation discussed about the "Politics of Environmental Law in the Perspective of Regional Autonomy towards Legal Ecological Sustainability". And he has published fundamental publications which are used as environmental study references, among of it as follow: "Environmental Law : Global and National Perspectives", "Enforcement of environmental law in a holistic-ecological perspective" and "Politics of environmental law: dynamics and reflections on the product of local autonomy law.



Prof. Dr. Idris Fassasi, LL.M.
University Paris II Panthéon-Assas

Idris Fassasi is a constitutional lawyer. Starting on September 1st 2018, he will be a Professor of Public Law at the University of Amiens, France. He was previously an Associate Professor of Public Law at University Paris II Panthéon-Assas. His areas of interest include constitutional law, international human rights law and international law. He has won several academic awards, including a Fulbright scholarship, and was a visiting researcher at New York University School of Law. Idris previously worked at the United Nations Office of the High Commissioner for Human Rights in Geneva and interned at the Conseil Constitutionnel in Paris.



Prof. Hikmahanto Juwana, S.H., LL.M., Ph.D.
Faculty of Law University of Indonesia

Specialization in international law, Prof. Hikmahanto Juwana, S.H., LL.M., Ph.D, Hikmahanto is the youngest professor in history of Faculty of Law University of Indonesia (FHUI) or even in Indonesia. He succeeded in streamlining his time in Japan until finally earning a master's degree from Keio University with the title of thesis An International Law Perspective of Space Commercialization: Conflict of Interest between the Developed and Developing State.

CONFERENCE PRESENTATIONS

Each paper has been allocated a maximum of 15 minutes for presentation. This applies as well to papers with multiple authors/ speakers. A question and answer session will follow after all speakers have presented. Due to the large number of papers, speakers are respectfully advised to keep strictly to the time allocated to them. This is necessary to ensure that the conference proceeds on time.

Each session venue is equipped with a computer and LCD projector. Presenters who wish to use Microsoft PowerPoint slides during the presentation may do so by saving their slides on a USB drive or a compact disc (CD). A student assistant or a technician will be available 15 minutes before the start of each session to assist speakers upload their slides onto the presentation computer. Presenters are expected to be at the session venue at least 10 minutes before their sessions begin.

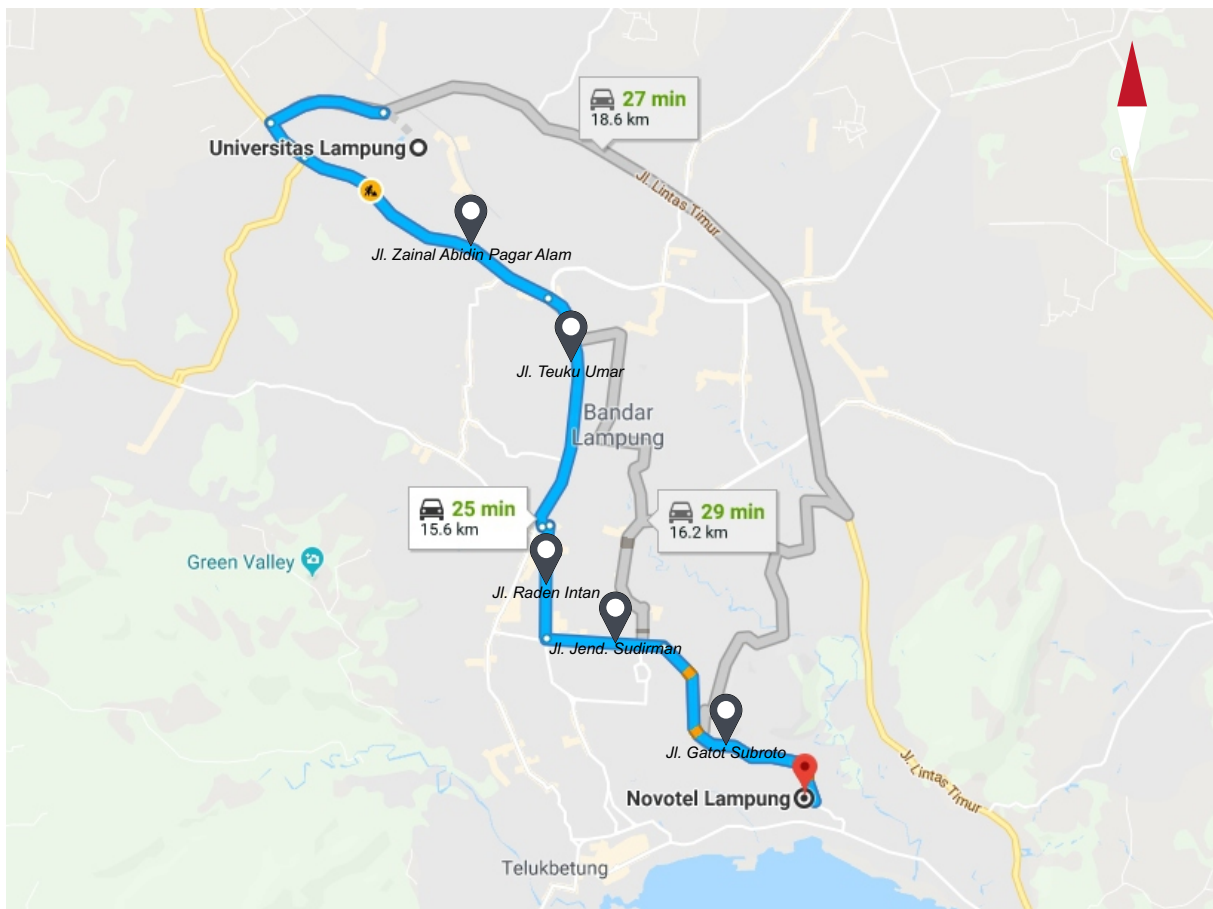

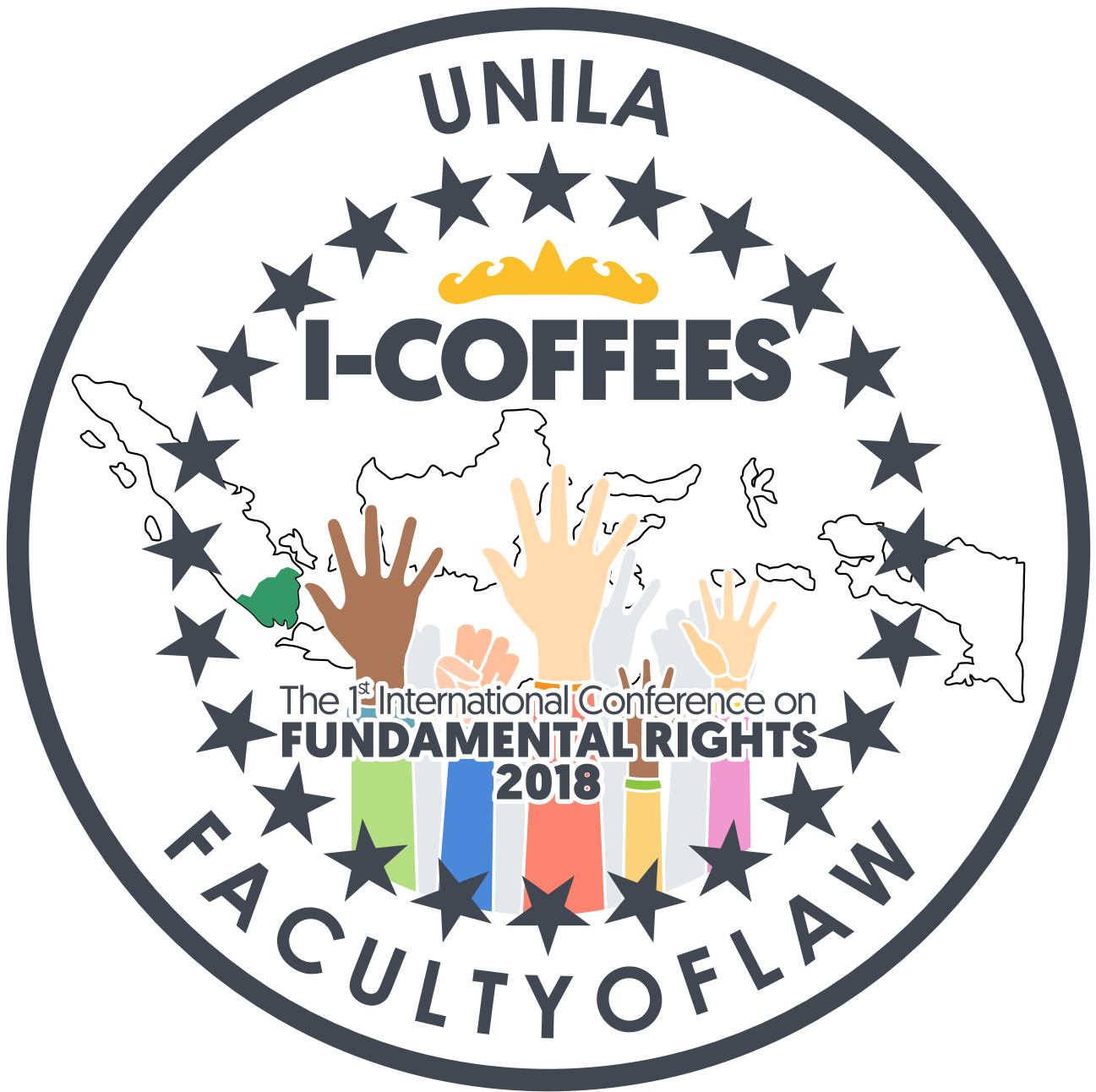
